What subject(s) did you study during Sixth Form?

I studied History, Art, English and Maths. I felt that this gave me a broad, well-rounded experience. I loved being able to study different subjects, but many of them also complemented each other.

What are you studying now and where, and what would like to do next?

I am a full-time student at the University of Leicester, studying History, although I am currently embarking on my Year Abroad in Munich, Germany! Over the next year I aim to use my time in Germany to help me write my dissertation on German Art during the Nazi period. After this year, I will be returning to Leicester to complete my degree, then I will hopefully be able to complete my Masters in Art History at the University of Birmingham.

What was your experience of Sixth Form like?

It was stressful, but fun! I was able to make the most of a wide variety of opportunities during my two years in Sixth Form, such as a trip to Zambia, working with the Lawn Tennis Association, and holding a position on the student council. All of my teachers were so unbelievably supportive! I particularly struggled with Maths, and my teacher would hold weekly after school sessions to help myself and other students with any work we found difficult.
