• **Mock exams will be conducted in the following venues:**

- **Sports hall** and **K2 building** on the far side of the car park. Yr13 students will have to make their way promptly to their area.



There are 2 exam sessions per day:

- **Morning** – 09.00-11.00 (arrive 08.45) **Afternoon** – 13.00-15.05 (arrive 12.45)

Yr13 Lunch (if you have an afternoon exam):

- Yr13 who have exams in the afternoon **will have their lunch during the KS3 (12.20-12.45) slot.**

Other details:

- Once outside the exam venue, you will be called in to be seated by the invigilators and exams team.
- Mobile phones and all watches will need to be turned off and handed into invigilators.
- All coats and bags will need to be placed at the back/side of the exam venue.

Rules:

1. Bring your ID card- this will be required as invigilators need this to check your ID
2. Water/drinks need to have label removed
3. Late students will not get extra time
4. You cannot leave an exam early.
5. Know your centre number (20730) and your candidate number (usually on desk)
6. The invigilator will complete a malpractice form if a student refuses to follow instructions.
7. No exam, no grade.
